Five Paragraph Essay Lapbook

- Students will be provided materials to make a lapbook. We will be selecting one person to research using both one book source and one online article.
- The students will write a 5 paragraph essay on their selected person, including an introduction, a paragraph about their early life, a paragraph about their adulthood, a paragraph about their notable achievements and a concluding paragraph.
- Students can print off pictures to include in their lapbook presentation.
- At the end of the research project, students will present their person to the class so we can all learn a little more about their achievements.
